There are 710 places to buy alcohol in South Lanarkshire:

457 on-sales premises (pubs and restaurants)





253 off-sales premises (supermarkets and shops)

Scottish Liquor Licensing Statistics 2021-22.

In South Lanarkshire, 22% of people drink above the Chief Medical Officers' low-risk auidelines.

This includes 14% of women and 30% of men.

This compares to 20% of people in Scotland who drink above the quidelines.



Parental drinking was a concern identified for 19% of children on the child protection register in South Lanarkshire.

Children's Social Work Statistics 2022-23.

35% of 13-year-olds and 74% of 15-year-olds in South Lanarkshire have drunk alcohol.

Of those who have ever drunk alcohol, 55% of 13-year-olds and 73% of 15-year-olds have been drunk.

Scottish Schools Adolescent Lifestyle and Substance Use Survey 2018.

There were 1,986 alcohol-related hospital admissions in South Lanarkshire in 2022-23.

Alcohol related hospital statistics 2022-23.

The admission rate was higher than for Scotland as a whole.





In South Lanarkshire, 95 people died because of alcohol in 2023, from conditions solely caused by alcohol.

Alcohol-specific deaths 2023.

The death rate was higher than Scotland as a whole.



Alcohol-specific deaths 2023.

The true number of alcohol deaths is over twice as high when including conditions such as cancer and cardiovascular diseases.

Public Health Scotland.

Every year, alcohol costs South Lanarkshire £93.83m or £301 per person.
